



Enlarging grid patterns is so easy that children can do it. Each side of a square equals one inch.

- Enlarge the easiest patterns directly onto a large sheet of any paper. Using a measuring tape, measure and mark all corner points of the pattern on the paper. Then draw the full-size pattern by connecting the points with lines as shown.
- To enlarge a pattern with more details, use a cardboard cutting board with a grid printed on it. Tape a sheet of tracing paper to the full-size grid by marking all corners and then connecting them with lines as shown. Or use a one-inch grid paper.

Sewing directions

Bend 16-gauge galvanized wire to match the pattern. Cut two layers of organza and one layer of fusible web, each about 1-2" larger all around than wire frame. With wire frame and fusible web between the organza layers, cover with press cloth, and press with a hot iron to fuse. Trim and hotglue ribbon around edges for decoration. Cut two pieces of twill tape, about 10" long each, crisscross at center back, and stitch or hotglue to wings, leaving the twill tape ends free. Pin the free ends to dress back.
