# How to Fold Your Flip!

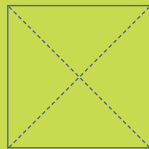


## DIY For Reading!

1. Cut it out! Cut the Flip along the dotted line.



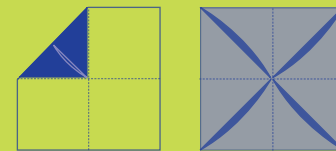
2. Crease it! Fold the square paper from corner to corner and open it back up.



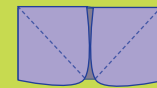
3. Flip it over! Fold each point into the center to make a smaller square.



4. Flip it over again! Fold each point into the center to make an even smaller square.



5. Fold it in half.



6. Place your index fingers and thumbs underneath each flap – and you're ready to play!

*Try This: Match a child's mood and interests with the right book.*
