

TEACHER TIPS



Color Eva's Treehouse

GRADE: PREK

Eva's home is unique! While kids color and practice number identification, start a class discussion about different kinds of homes (animal and human).

TIP: Spell and say the color words together to boost early reading skills.

Help Eva Get Home

GRADE: PREK

On Eva the Owlet, Kira uses a map to explore town. As kids complete this map to Eva's house, they also build letter recognition and fine-motor skills.

TIP: Before doing this activity, have students practice writing the letters E, F, and B.

Who's in the Band?

GRADE: PREK

When Eva and her friends start a band, each owl plays a different instrument. Find out which instrument each of them play with this activity page.

TRY THIS: Provide small percussion instruments for your class. Model a rhythm pattern and ask kids to repeat it, then try new patterns to challenge their listening and motor skills.

What Do You Love?

GRADES: K-1

Eva's diary writing builds self-awareness and feelings of gratitude. Strengthen your students' social emotional skills with this draw-and-write page.

TIP: Have pre-writers dictate their sentences to you. **TRY THIS:** Display finished work on a bulletin board titled, "THINGS WE LOVE."

Help the Planet!

GRADES: K-1

Working together is important, whether it's to win the Treetop Treat contest or clean up the community.

Brainstorm ways kids can help with this activity sheet.

TRY THIS: Pair with an article or video about environmental advocate Greta Thunberg.

I'm With the Band!

GRADES: K-1

In Eva in the Band, Eva learns that everyone has different talents. Invite kids to discuss talents or interests that they have before they complete this activity.

TIP: Suggest other ways that students might contribute to a band, like making the costumes, or organizing rehearsals. Remind the class that every job is important to a group's success.

A Tree About ME!

GRADES: 2-3

This activity is perfect for building classroom community and connections.

TRY THIS: Collect the information and use it for math lessons. Create class graphs of likes or dislikes and invite kids to write data-analysis word problems.

Nature Walk

GRADES: 2-3

Eva's diary entries are usually full of details. This page asks kids to help Eva describe her day.

TRY THIS: Show the class a variety of leaves (include many different colors and shapes). Put the leaves in a bag and select one. Without showing it to students, describe the leaf, and have them guess which one you chose. Each sentence should get more specific, to show the power of describing words. (It's a leaf. It's a big leaf. It's a big, red leaf with three pointed edges.)

Eva's Musical Word Find

GRADES: 2-3

Whether you're reading Eva's in the Band or learning music-related words, this word find is a fun way to build vocabulary.

TIP: Use this page as a morning starter or as a fast finisher activity.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

Color Eva's Treehouse

GRADE: PREK

Eva's home is unique. So is yours. Ask: How is our home like Eva's? How is it different?

TIP: As your child uses the Color Key, they will build skills identifying numbers and colors. Spell and say the color words together to boost early reading skills, too!

Help Eva Get Home

GRADE: PREK

On Eva the Owlet, Kira uses a map to explore town. This activity asks your child to create a map to Eva's house. Bonus: They'll also build letter recognition and fine-motor skills!

TIP: Look at the letters together, pointing out that the F has two horizontal lines, the E has three, and the B has closed curves instead of straight lines.

Who's in the Band?

GRADE: PREK

When Eva and her friends start a band, each of them plays a different instrument. Help your child use visual details to find the matching owls.

TRY THIS: Play a song your child likes. While you listen, take turns pretending to play a different instrument or sing. Ask: What would you like to do in a band?

What Do You Love?

GRADES: K-1

Writing down things you love, like Eva does in her diary, is important for emotional health.

TIP: If needed, have your child dictate their sentence to you.

Help the Planet!

GRADES: K-1

Whether you're doing some spring cleaning or just shopping for groceries, there's never a bad time to

help our planet. Use everyday tasks to talk about small changes that can have a big impact.

TIP: Build self-esteem and be a role model! Choose one thing from your child's list and commit to do it.

I'm With the Band!

GRADES: K-1

In Eva in the Band, Eva learns that everyone has different talents. Ask: What talents do you have or want to grow?

TRY THIS: Challenge your child to make up a verse of their band's hit song. Perform it together!

A Tree About ME!

GRADES: 2-3

Eva finds new things to love and learn in every episode of Eva the Owlet. Your child can share what they love, and want to learn about, on this fill-in page.

TRY THIS: Use the library! Ask your local librarian to help you find some age-appropriate books that match your child's interests.

Nature Walk

GRADES: 2-3

Eva's diary entry only tells the facts. Invite your child to add describing words, then talk about the difference the added words make.

TRY THIS: Go on a nature walk together. Take turns describing the things you see.

Eva's Musical Word Find

GRADES: 2-3

This fun word find is an opportunity to review and practice identifying music-themed words, like the ones in Eva's in the Band.

TIP: Have a dictionary handy so your child can look up any unfamiliar words.
